A great number of you good gentles have come forward to express interest in our fair shire. I am grateful for this interest and hope to serve you well.

To any who would be interested in holding some office within the shire, we are looking for deputys (assistants to the major officers). Please contact me for more information. Nominations to confirm and/or elect new officers will take place in early spring. Medieval times were not democratic ones, but this is the SCA - the Current Middle Ages - so nominations will be solicited from shire members and a polling of all members to approve or refute said nominations will take place.

It is the right of the people of the shire with voting status to overrule policy created on the shire level with a 2/3 vote (you must be able to prove at LEAST associate membership in order to vote). The policy in question must be published in the newsletter prior to voting. Proxy voting will be allowed only if offered in writing to the Seneshcal before the start of the meeting at which the vote is to take place.

This shire is your land in the SCA. If you do not voice your desires or discontent, we cannot help you to fulfill your dream in the Current Middle Ages. Please feel at liberty to call me any evening or drop me a note at PO Box 2040, Glens Falls, N.Y. 12801 - honest, I very seldom bite.

For those of you who are considering membership but are undecided as to which membership level to choose, here's some of the differences between sustaining and associate:

A SUSTAINING MEMBERSHIP costs \$20 per year. At this level you receive "Pike Staff" monthly and "Tournaments Illustrated" quarterly. In order to hold certain SCA offices, it is required to maintain a sustaining membership.

An ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP costs \$6 per year. This level has the same privleges, but you do NOT receive any publications and cannot hold some offices. You must be able to prove at least associate membership to have any voting priviledges.

Good news for you fighters under 18. It looks like you can train with boffers until you reach 18 and can legally train with rattan. We are waiting for written confirmation and rules.

In closing, I hope you can attend our workshops, and if you have any skills along these lines, from calligraphy to backgammon, consider volunteering to share your skills and pass them along.

I look forward to meeting with all at our second gathering on Saturday, December 10 (for more details see below) and after.

MEETINGS & OTHER SUCH THINGS TO DO

The following meetings and assorted workshops have been scheduled in such an order as to develop your SCA-dian self and prepare to attend SCA-dian events. We shall have our first, unofficial mini-event to trial-run our new SCA-dian selves at a Pot Luck Supper on Saturday, January 14. We are shooting for early spring to host our first official SCA event. Until then, our meeting and workshop schedule follows:

Sat/Dec 10 at Christ Church United Methodist, Bay St., Glens Falls:

- 10 am basic garb, if you have fabric already, bring your portable sewing machines, scissors and either a comfortable, well-fitting cotton shirt or a t-shirt you don't mind trashing plus a roll of duct tape.
- 12 pm basic armor, information to get fledgling fighters suited up and on track. Rules of the Marshallett will also be reviewed.
- 2 pm GENERAL MEETING, bring a list of what you wish to pursue in the SCA and any suggestions and skills you have to share - mundane included. Also discussion about demos & programs in education with assistance by LARAC.
- 2:30 showing of TV-8's "North Country" segment featuring Crown Tourney at City Park and "Open Line" featuring interviews with veteran SCA-dians.
- Wed/Dec 14 at the Glens Falls National Bank Community Center, downtown Glens Falls. Travelling south on Glen St., just turn right into the aidestreet between Achenbachs Jewelers and Associates of Glens Falls and park in that lot. The Community Center entrance is at the rear of the same brick building that houses Associates of Glens Falls. Big white letters "Community Center" above the glass door mark the entrance.
  - 7-9 pm garb workshop follow-up, by now you should have fabric or even be ready for finishing touches - bring those portable sewing machines. Also, discussion about developing a personna and "do's and don't's" on both.
- Wed/Dec 28 at the Glens Falls National (GFN) Community Center, downtown GF 7-9 pm - feast gear, and how to go to an event (formal vs. informal, how to pack, what and what not to expect and how about children, and more).
- Sat/Jan 7 at GFN Community Center again
  - 10 am calligraphy workshop, bring felt-tip calligraphic pen or carpenter's pencil, paper will be supplied.
  - 10 am more help with garb
  - 12 pm needlework basics workshop
  - 2 pm GENERAL MEETING, discuss Pot Luck Supper
  - 3 pm dance workshop/period games
  - 5 pm basic heraldry
  - 7 pm cooking for the Current Middle Ages
  - 9 pm site closes

A LITTLE BIT OF WHO'S WHO & WHAT'S WHAT

SCA-dians (members of the SCA) use words or refer to a number of terms that are unfamiliar or used in a somewhat different context in the mundane world. Here's a brief reference list, by no means complete, of some of the more common terms you're apt to come across:

anachronism:	Anything out of its proper time.
Anno Societatus:	In the year of the society, this being the 23rd (XXIII) since the SCA was formed.
arms:	The heraldic emblem that identifies a person, group
dimb.	or place. The right to that emblem being the gift
	of Royalty, and the specific content being subject to
	approval by the Kingdom College of Heralds and the
	SCA College of Arms.
autocrat:	The individual in charge of a specific event. the first level of award that conveys rank in the
Award of Arms (AOA):	
	SCA, giving the holder the right to bear heraldic
	arms and to use the title Lord or Lady.
Exchequer:	Treasurer
Chatelaine:	The officer in charge of greeting and helping
	newcomers, arranging educational demos.
	The officer in charge of a group's newsletter.
	Word called by someone about to draw a steel weapon.
corpora:	The official governing document of the SCA, defining
	the overall mundane and medieval structure of the
	organization. You can order a copy from the SCA Stock
	Clerk.
court:	A formal gathering of an SCA chapter, presided over
	by officers or royalty. The leading herald serves as
	announcer and master of ceremonies, and must review
	and approve all business brought before court in
	advance. The primary activities of a court include
	announcements, presentations and award-giving.
device:	A heraldic emblem registered to an individual or
	group. It becomes your "arms" when you receive an AOA or
	higher award.
feast gear:	Tableware. Guests of SCA feasts are expected to bring
	everything they need to eat in comfort - plates,
	bowls, goblets, utensils, tablecloth, cloth napkins,
	candleholder and candles.
Glenn Linn:	Gaelic: (Glenn) a mountain valley following the
	course of a stream; (Linn) a water fall or

cascading water.

garb: The	clothing	worn to	an SCA	event.

- Herald: The officer in charge of development and registration of names and devices, and for making announcements at court and elsewhere.
  - HOLD! A cry meaning "Stop immediately in your tracks." there is a hazard at hand.
- lists: The border of a field on which a tournament is held, also refers to the roster of fighters who will take part in the tournament.
- Marshall: The officer in charge of safety, training and supervision of SCA combat.

Minister of Arts: The officer in charge of coordinating arts activities, workshops.

mka: mundanely known as

mundame: Referring to anything or anyone part of the 20th c. Oyez! Cry used by heralds to gain attention of populace for an announcement.

- persona: The character created and assumed by an SCA member. SCA-dian: A member of the SCA.
- scribe: Calligrapher, someone who writes the decorative scrolls used to commemorate SCA awards, and prepares other formal documents of the group.
- Seneschal: The chief administrative officer and legal representative of a particular SCA group, responsible for coordinating the activities of the group's other officers.
- troll booth: The place where you sign-in at an event, pay any site fees, sign any waivers particular to that event.

In the SCA's Current Middle Ages, there are a few "no no's" new members

should be aware of. Afterall, chivalry and courtesy top the list of our organization's priorities.

Please take care to NOT wear red or white belts or sashes, or plain neck chains. These adornments are symbols of earned positions, such as knighthood. Also, do not wear metal circlets upon your head even to hold veils or other head gear, as they also indicate different stations that have been earned, of leadership or royal status.

When addressing fellow SCA-dians, it is appropriate to say "Milord" or "Milady," however, the titles of simply "Lord" so and so or "Lady" so and so are used for those who have been awarded the priviledge.

It is correct and proper to call our King and Queen "Your Majesty," and our Crown Prince and Princess (heir to the throne) "Your Highness." Others wearing crowns could be a Baron or Baroness, Count or Countess - unless you know them by exact title, it is safe to refer to them as "Your Excellency."

I hope this helps all of our new friends, most being mundanes in transition. I remain, in service to all gentles.
